To solve this problem, you begin with your known quantity, the 278 mol of nitrogen that's to be reacted. You multiply that quantity by the mole-mole conversion factor that relates moles of nitrogen to moles of ammonia. You write the conversion factor so that mol NH₃ is on top and mol N₂ is on the bottom.

After that, put the units of whatever you were given in the bottom right of the T, and the units of what you want to find in the top right.

Solution: Step 1: List the known quantities and plan the problem. Known Given: 75.0 g Sn Molar mass of Sn = 118.69 g/mol 1 mol Sn... Step 2: Solve. (12.3.3) 75.0 g Sn × 1 mol Sn /118.69 g Sn × 2 mol HF / 1 mol Sn = 1.26 mol HF Step 3: Think about your result.

Moles to Grams Example Problem . On the other hand, sometimes you're given a value in moles and need to convert it to grams. To do this, first calculate the molar mass of a sample. Then, multiply it by the number of moles to get an answer in grams:

How to Convert Grams to Moles and Vice Versa

grams Na₃PO₄ = (grams reactant) × (mole of reactant/molar mass of reactant) × (mole ratio: product/reactant) × (molar mass of product/mole product) Amount of Na₃PO₄ formed from 35.60 grams of NaOH

Calculate the mass of 6.022 × 10²³ molecule of Calcium carbonate (CaCO₃). Solution —. Molar mass (Molecular mass in gram) of CaCO₃ = 40+12+3×16 = 100 g. No. of moles of CaCO₃ = No. of molecules/Avogadro constant. = 6.022 × 10²³ / 6.022 × 10²³. = 1 mole. Mass of CaCO₃ = No. of moles × molar mass.
